RENEWED STRENGTH


Recently you probably received a stewardship campaign request. The reasons for this are explained in the letter. In brief, we hope to refinance the mortgage to reduce expenses. This will allow us to continue to provide a space for the ministries that this church committed many years ago of providing a place for scouting and daycare. But in order to secure the refinanced loan, we need to show that we have a balanced budget. Commitments from a stewardship campaign is the way in which we can do this.

I want to take this space to address why giving to the church is important. The earliest example of giving to God in the Bible occurred in Genesis 4. Two brothers, Cain and Abel, brought sacrifices to God. One gave from the produce he had grown as a farmer and the other gave from the livestock he had raised. God was pleased with the livestock and not the produce. This was because of the attitude in which these gifts were brought. Abel had given the livestock with an attitude of wanting to please God. Cain had given the produce with an attitude of meeting an obligation.

At the end of Acts 4 and beginning of Acts 5, another example of giving out of pleasing God and out of obligation occurs. Joseph of Cyprus gave the proceeds of having sold a field he owned because he wanted to share with the other believers. Ananias and Sapphira did the same, but they kept some of the money for themselves and lied about how much they had given. They wanted others to think that that they had done something great, but in reality they were holding back.

From these two examples, we see two ways in which giving can be done improperly. A sense of obligation and wanting others to think great things about the giver. Neither of these is proper. The only right way to give is with a cheerful heart according to 2 Cor. 9:7. And so again, I am asking you to carefully examine what you are able to give, to make a commitment to it and to let the office know what that amount will be so that we can write our budget for 2024. With this the church and live into renewed strength
