
The word "holiday" derives from two words: "holy" and "day." Thus, in its original meaning "holiday" was meant to mean days that are set aside as holy. However, we also have secular holidays. September has two of them: Labor Day (the first Monday in September) and Patriots Day (September 11). But they (whoever "they" are) have created other holidays to commemorate and celebrate other things, or just for fun. The website nationaltoday.com lists many, many days such as this. For example, September 1 is Ginger Cat Appreciation Day and National Tofu Day, to name a few. September 3 is National Pet Rock Day. September 6 is National Coffee Ice Cream Day.

There are many others, and every day has multiple things that someone is celebrating.

Perhaps one of the more wellknown days in September is Grandparent's Day on the second Sunday of the month. The history of this day dates to 1969 when a 9-year-old boy named Russell Capper suggested, in writing, to President Nixon that a day should be set aside to honor grandparents. In the early 70s, Marian McQuade, a member of the West Virginia Commission on Aging and Nursing Home Licensing Board took up the cause resulting in West Virginia Governor Arch Moore declaring the first Grandparents Day in 1973. Within a few years, Marian Continued on Page 3.

McQuade, had urged 43 states to do the same. And in 1977, Senator Jennings Randolph brought it before the Senate, leading to adoption by them, then the Congress, and finally President Jimmy Carter declaring a national Grandparents Day in 1978.

Perhaps one of the most important things that comes from days like Grandparents Day or other days that celebrate people are the relationships. During the month of September, the Scriptures we will read on Sundays and the sermons that are preached from them will deal with relationships. On September 3, we will wrap up the series on Sabbath while thinking about how practicing Sabbath can help us to see that all people are equal in God's eyes.



We have been using the book by Dr. A.W. Tozer to guide our worship times during this series. The book is called Whatever Happened to Worship: A Call to True Worship.

During our June worship we went over the dangers that we can face as Christians. We can sometimes have the "we made it attitude" and pat ourselves on the back. But, we know from scripture that isn't all there is. Worship requires a "Be Prepared" attitude. Our identity is also given to us by God. It is not some ID card we can pull out and use to prove we are His rather, it is a way of life, a connection between the Spirit and us that frames how we worship and how we live. Without that connection we never can truly worship.

July was about New Birth. We must remember that we don't just go to church to worship. To worship God is to know Him and recognize just how much respect and awe he deserves. We must understand more about Him, His love, mercy, grace, what pleases Him, and what brings disappointment. Our worship reflects who we believe God is. Do we have an honest fear of God, the one who holds power over all, death, life, heaven, hell, even eternity? Will we allow it to change us, to shape us into a new creation that is personally and hopelessly with God our Father?

August we talked about why we bother coming to worship along with what sacrifices are required and how we can apply those to worship today.

Although we won't be outside, we are planning to continue these fourth Saturday worship night's through the fall. We hope to see you with us on Saturday, Sept. 23.

On September 10, we will think about the relationships that couples have as we read Genesis 2:4-25 and the account of God's creation of men and women. 


